We teach the British National Curriculum, together with the Ministry of Education curricular requirements, and a thematic approach will be used across the subjects. Following a broad provision in Years 7 to 9 (Key Stage 3), Years 10 and 11 (Key Stage 4) students will be able to select options for further study leading to IGCSE examinations.
